In maths we have been looking at volume and capacity. We have been reading scales measuring in ML and L. Next week we will be looking at thermometers and reading the scale on them.


In science we are going to test our walls we built last week. We are going to look at whether they are waterproof and whether they withstand the wind.

### Anxiety - tip to help support your child

#### How anxiety works:

It's fuelled by unrealistic, exaggerated thoughts - for example:

"If I go outside, I will definitely get stung by a bee."

We need to help children replace those exaggerated thoughts with realistic ones. Thoughts like:

"I've been outside lots of times but I've never actually been stung by a bee."

#### How do you do it?

Through careful questioning.

When your child raises their exaggerated thought, try asking these two questions:

- \* Is it true?
- \* I mean is it true, without exception, literally 100% of the time?

Get them to recall the exceptions and pay attention to them.

This approach won't work immediately - you'll have to repeat the conversation multiple times.

But over time, this form of questioning helps our children move their thinking from: this dreaded event will definitely happen  $\rightarrow$  to it might happen  $\rightarrow$  to it very rarely happens.

Of course, there are other types of questions you can use to encourage realistic thinking.



#### Attendance Update


#### The PINS Project - update from Mrs Langton

We are underway with our work towards the PINS Project! (Partnerships for Inclusion of Neurodiversity in Schools) We had a visit today from a member of the Autism Team to support us with completing an audit and planning what support and training we would like for next year. I'm feeling so excited about this opportunity to develop confidence and understanding about Neurodiversity across the school - both with staff and pupils.

As part of this, I would really love to strengthen the partnership between us at school and you as parents and carers. I am thinking about setting up some kind of Parent Carer group as a way of school and parents / carers working together so we can get your input into school policy and practice. This is one area I am putting forward to the PINS Team as something we want to develop. 


