














Year 1

Next half term we have lots of new activities and topics for you to engage in. I am really looking forward to our last half term together and seeing what amazing things we can achieve together.


The year 2 team wish you a happy and safe half term. Have lots of well deserved fun and make sure you stay safe. See you all after half term.

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Year 4 News


Well done Year 4, you have worked hard all half term. In particular, you have all worked so hard on the presentation of your work. Keep up this hard work.


In maths, we have finished our work on decimals and smashed our end-of-unit assessment.

In art, we have used different mediums to create detailed nest drawings, they were brilliant!


Have a well-deserved break year 4, ready and recharged, to end the year on a high.

Parent Led CBT Workshop - Cornwall Mental Health Support Team






Attendance Update
