This week has been full of fantastic learning in year 1!

In English we have continued to learn our class story - Beegu, which is all about a little Alien who gets lost on Earth. At the beginning of the week we were exploring question sentences and looking at key vocabulary. Over the past couple of days we have been innovating our stories. The children have thought very carefully about their own Alien who gets lost on Earth.

We have been super Mathematicians this week, exploring fractions. We have been finding and recognising half of a shape and quantity, as well as, finding and recognising a quarter of a shape and quantity.

Year 1 have been learning all about Africa and Australia this week in geography. We have explored what money is used in the different continents, what animals live their and the population. In Science we have been exploring invertebrates, we explored the different types of animals that do not have a back bone and wrote lots of interesting facts about these animals.

In RE we have been studying the Holy Spirit and how the Holy Spirit guides you to help and serve others.

This week in forest school we got the chance to look at real birds nest and how they are made. We then had a go at making our very own birds nests and year 1 did a super job.

Well done year 1, what a fun filled week!!

Wow, year 2. What a busy week we have had, we have been learning lots about Space and about the different planets in our solar system. We have also learnt about the oceans. See if the children can remember what percentage of the Earth is water! We have been working on fractions in maths and we are looking at the Lighthouse Keepers's Lunch in English.

It's been another busy week in year 3! We've been working hard in our writing lessons, creating an opening and resolution to the Clock Tower. Next week we'll be editing before completing our final write. In maths we've been using bar models and number lines to find equivalent fractions, and in geography we've studied how fold mountains and volcanoes are formed. In science we've been researching synthetic materials, how these are formed and what they can be used for; in RE we've been studying the Trinity and how prayers and hymns are used to help us remember this. A great week with lots of fantastic learning - well done, year 3!

In science we have been identifying and understanding physical and chemical changes.

Attendance update

Whole school attendance is currently 94.9% for the school year. Year 6 have won the trophy this week for class with the highest attendance. Year 6 achieved 96.2% closely followed by Years 3 and 4 who had 96% and 96.1% - it was very close this week !
